Practice Guidelines

September 13, 2014

- All participants shall adhere to the requirements outlined in the RCMP *Cowboy Mounted Shooting Associations Suggested Operating Conditions/Requirements/Guidelines*
- When you purchase your annual AMSA membership, the Club Secretary forwards your legal land description to the Office of the Chief Firearms Office (per Section 3.a. of the RCMP *Cowboy Mounted Shooting Associations Suggested Operating Conditions/Requirements/Guidelines*).
- If you have not included your legal land description on your membership application, or if you move, it is your responsibility to make sure the AMSA secretary receives your legal land description, and your updated mailing address (as appropriate), prior to practices taking place!
- **All participants** must have a valid PAL (Possession Acquisition Licence), restricted firearms licence, and a current AMSA membership or a current membership from another Alberta mounted shooting club. We also recommend that all participants have Alberta Equestrian Federation insurance. REMEMBER THAT YOUR AMSA MEMBERSHIP EXPIRES ON DECEMBER 31ST OF EACH YEAR. YOU MUST HAVE A CURRENT MEMBERSHIP TO PRACTICE AND/OR TO TRANSPORT YOUR GUNS.
- No person shall participate while under the influence of alcohol or other impairing substances. Zero tolerance is in effect. Violations will result in expulsion from the AMSA.

Practice, Orientations, Demonstrations or Events on Public Property

- Legal land locations must be submitted to the AMSA secretary, who then forwards the information to the Office of the Chief Firearms Officer. Information should be received a minimum of two weeks in advance of the activity taking place.
- All requirements outlined above also apply.
